Vocational Education & Employment



The Vocational Workers have been very busy this year trying to support consumers and meet their goals. We have been having some fun along the way too! The consumers we are working with are asking for training, resume development, resume updates, help with job searching, and support when they start a new job. Hopefully we have met all the needs of each consumer and we hope they are happy with our work!

Recently we have been looking at new devices and technology. Everything from updated apps to stethoscopes for Hard of Hearing consumers that are entering into the medical field. We also have been helping our consumers with applications to scholarships and grants for post-secondary education and setting up new ways to take short training courses that are required to enter long-term college or university programs. Some of these included the Transferring, Lifting, Repositioning course and First Aid/CPR/AED course. We are supporting job maintenance by helping to resolve issues in the workplace and by offering communication supports like posters, pamphlets, and other information to employers. Consumers also needed support in writing an incident report, applying to jobs, and Interpreter support at appointments with SAC, PIE, and at post-secondary institutions.

One of the workshops we recently hosted was an Introduction to Photography. It was 4 sessions throughout the month of July. We had an inspiring professional Deaf Photographer, Rylyn Delaney, present and talk about her work, and she assigned street photography as homework to the participants. It was great to see their creativity shine through! We also had a CODA professional Photographer, Kristina Haines, join us for a session and present on some tips and tricks for portrait photography - she showed us cool footage from a drone capturing a photoshoot that she did. 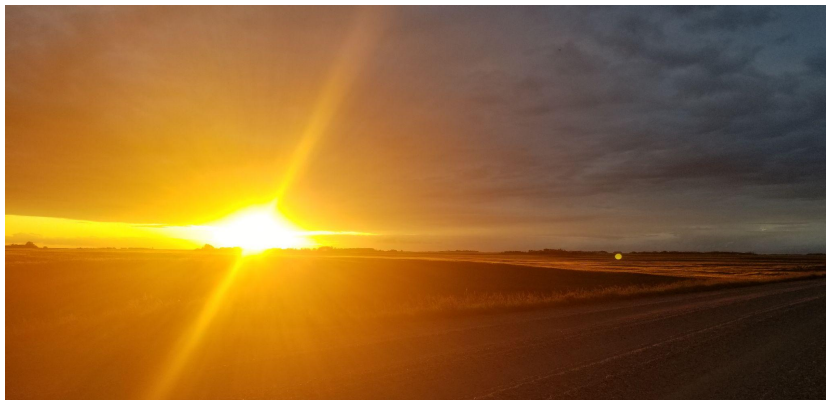

It is estimated that more than 700 million people - 1/10 people - will have disabling hearing loss by 2050.



When unaddressed, hearing loss can impact individuals in various ways, including their communication and speech, cognition, education and employment opportunities, social isolation, and mental health.
