# Executive Director's Message

### Nairn Gillies

Covid-19 has struck our province in a fourth wave and this one showed up in our office. In consultation with Staff and Board, we went to remote services for 3 weeks and were able to reopen as of February 7. I am currently back in office while others are self-isolating. Staff who test positive, are still working from home.

The 4C Preschool in Saskatoon had several meetings and discussions about how best to ride out the fourth wave. These discussions included the 4C Preschool Staff, Parents, Kami, and myself. We decided to follow the Saskatoon greater Catholic school division procedures.

The SDHHS staff has developed a greater cohesion and is working effectively as a team. The work our Staff have been doing to be inclusive for all d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing has been spectacular. The team has produced accessible videos and resource materials for d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing to access literacy online. Our ASL children's stories have caught the attention of agencies nationwide, from Vancouver Island to Nova Scotia. And we have been working with many other organizations across Canada to raise the standards of service. The Canadian Association of the Deaf (CAD) has been supportive and responsive to the need for teacher training and ASL proficiency screening for Teachers and Interpreters. SDHHS continues to host a Deaf Book Club, youth events, senior's coffee, and promote inclusion for language and literacy access for everyone.

We have taken on two Interpreter Training Program students so far this year, one is Rachel who is doing fabulous. She is from Saskatchewan so there is a good chance she will make her home here in the province. She is very gifted and would be an asset wherever she goes. The second student will start in Regina soon.

I want to recognize all of the Staff for their flexibility; they were able to pack up and provide services remotely in an instant and then reopen the offices, with no troubles. Each staff has gone above and beyond to support the community.

When I asked, "What were the positive things that happened this quarter?" most staff talked about how we were able to provide services no matter what the circumstance. The youth have been very active. There is a growing feeling of hope that soon, the pandemic will be over.

It is again an honour to serve such a wonderful community.

## Vocational Education & Employment

We are very excited to begin the new year with consumers on adventures. A dream written down with a **DATE** becomes a goal. A goal broken down into **STEPS** becomes a plan. A plan backed by **ACTION** makes your dreams come true. This is exactly what we are working on with our consumers!

#### We wanted to share a success story with you!

Burton's lifetime career dream was to drive a skid steer. A skid steer is a small, versatile piece of construction equipment used primarily for digging. It's light and maneuverable, and its arms can attach to a range of tools for various construction jobs, snow moving, and landscaping!

Through the individualized funding we receive from the Ministry of Immigration and Career Training (MICT), SDHHS was able to provide ASL Interpreters and a Sign Support Professional for his two-day training. The Sign Support Professional assisted him in reading and studying prior to his training so that he was comfortable and familiar with the knowledge learned from his two-day training course. He has now





his two-day training course. He has now successfully completed his skid steer training and is certificated! We are so proud of you, Burton! Congratulations!

The ASL/ESL classes for registered consumers will be starting soon and will run as 3 or 4 day sessions depending on the focus topics. Also, we will provide workshops later this year – rules and regulations permitting. 




