Executive Director's Message Nairn Gillies

Happy New Year!

New Years is always a great opportunity to look back and be thankful for the year that was, and is a chance to look forward to the year that will be. This last year we saw the end to most of the Covid restrictions, and people started to return to a normal life... for that I am truly thankful.

While we continue to meet on Zoom often, it's nothing like the fellowship of being together in person. This fall we had an in-person strategic planning meeting, to plan for the future of Saskatchewan Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services. The Board and Staff met to discuss how we can improve services for d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing people in Saskatchewan, and how we can continue to eliminate barriers. The basic outcome of the meeting was that there needs to be "Community Resource Centre" hubs in both Saskatoon and Regina. These community resource centres would be a place for the community to meet and develop life skills, language, and education, and to function as a resource centre for family and community.

We discussed having a satellite office in La Ronge to meet the growing needs of the d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing community that is north of Prince Albert. Currently we are supporting 20 children and their families north of Prince Albert. The distance education hybrid model of accessible education and inclusion seems to be working.. but we still have work to do to meet the needs. We have also begun wellness checks and home visits for seniors and people who continue to be isolated. As always, we advocate for enhanced services for d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing people in Saskatchewan.

In November, The Government of Saskatchewan's Minister of Social services, Honorable Gene Makowski stood in the house to raise a second reading of Bill 103 "The Accessible Saskatchewan Act". On numerous occasions members of the community across Canada have reached out to the provincial governments and the federal government to advocate for the recognition of ASL (American Sign Language) as the language of the Deaf in Canada. This bill, called Bill 103, "The Accessible Saskatchewan Act", will formally recognize ASL as the language of the Deaf in Saskatchewan.

In Minister Makowski's speech about Bill 103 he quoted the disability strategy "nothing about us without us" and mentioned there needs to be members from the disability communities involved in helping craft this legislation. One of the things missing from their policy and procedures is referral for sign language programs for every child who has been diagnosed with a hearing loss. The United Nations Charter of Rights for Persons with Disabilities guarantees access to sign language programs for all children who have a diagnosis of a hearing loss.

As they have already, the government will continue to have formal consultations with members of the d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing community to ensure that they get the legislation and policies right.

2023 brings a very positive outlook.



The staff interpreting team remains to be consistent with Karen in Regina, Sue in Prince Albert, Brandie in Saskatoon and Barb in Swift Current. The schedule has picked up with the lifting of Covid restrictions. We appreciate the support of the Saskatchewan Deaf and Hard of Hearing community when we need to switch around the schedules in order to provide services to as many requests as possible. On average, less than 2 requests per month are not able to be filled. Vocational Education & Employment Jody & Patricia

Patti and I have been extremely busy again in the Vocational Department here at SDHHS.

We have just completed our first quarterly report for this contract year, and we are currently working with 49 d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing people throughout the province. We have attended a couple information sessions with the Ministry of Immigration and Career Training (MICT) to learn about our new reporting and registration processes. Our new MICT reporting spreadsheet is much easier to report with than last years'. This is saving us both time and energy!

I have had quite a few college and university students contacting me recently to ask about accommodations and technology to support people in the classroom, and for when they are going forward into the workplace. Finding assistive technology for specific types of hearing loss, distinct models of hearing aids and certain makes of cochlear implants is challenging, but we have a good relationship with a few audiologists across Saskatchewan, and they do make this a bit easier because of their training.

In Regina, Patti has been busy helping people update resumes and two of her clients have completed their Forklift training. One of Patti's clients has found part-time employment working as a Kitchen Helper at a child care center.

In Saskatoon I have been updating a few resumes, helping with job searching, and supporting people needing assistive technology. One of my clients recently found a full-time job in a warehouse, and another client has been hired for a part-time cleaning position.

We have both been making sure our clients have Computer Note-taking Services and ASL Interpreter supports for job interviews, orientations, training on-the-job, for workplace reviews, a couple staff meetings, and for short training courses.

Sign Support Professional Krissy

Krissy continues investigating barrier-free accessibility for the d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing community so they don't have to use their own personal resources.

She's been contacting internet and cell phone companies to looking into their accessibility accommodations for online interpreting when Canada VRS is not an option, and neither is using their own cell phone data. Finding alternatives to personal cell phone data for communication support, for example: seeking access to wifi hotspots specific to video interpreting, finding resources to better support persons with disabilities, and then adapting them to fit the needs of the DHH community, has been the main focus for Krissy - - ensuring the accommodations match the needs of the client, not the label.

With no availability to teach ASL in the Saskatoon and area high schools, Krissy has been doing some research to find other ways to make learning ASL accessible and still gain high school course credits through alternative options like clubs or special student projects.









Sign Support Professional Rae-Mairi

Rae-Mairi has continued to provide weekly online Zoom Sessions and 1 day/month In-Person visits to Northern communities. The communities so far include: Beauval, Spiritwood, Hall Lake, La Ronge, Sucker River and Prince Albert.

The use of ASL with youth, their Educational Assistants and family members has increased in Indigenous communities throughout all of Saskatchewan. Rae-Mairi has witnessed a positive transformation from the students who initially knew next to no signs, to being able to express themselves in basic ASL. She is looking forward to continuing the work with them and encouraging their successes in ASL literacy. She will have a few new schools and families to add to her list for similar supports in additional Northern Saskatchewan communities.

Rae-Mairi has visited Leask Community School. They are the only school program in Saskatchewan that is offering ASL classes. They are doing GREAT! The teacher there encouraged five students to perform songs in ASL at the Winter Festival. Everyone in their community loved it.

Rae-Mairi enjoyed presenting at the Saskatoon Inn for the Indigenous Education Conference. She has been working with several high school students focussing on life skills and preparing them for life after graduation.

To add to her plate, Rae-Mairi has been enjoying her role as an ASL instructor, teaching Level 2 (201 & 202) online through Zoom. She hopes to continue teaching in the springtime.

It has already been a year and half since Rae-Mairi began her employment at SDHHS. She looks forward what the new year has to offer her.

The Youth Activities Program has been quite successful in Regina. They have been active and enjoying their time together. They have had opportunities to socialize and thrive with their Deaf Culture & ASL.

Happy February to the community!

Things have been very busy at the 4C Preschool! There have been many great Friday Family Days venturing out to Wonderhub, the Western Development Museum, the Wildlife Festival at Prairieland Park, a Farm Corn Maze, DJ's Adventureland, and The Park YXE. In addition to these outings, we have also hosted activities in our classroom such as Pumpkin Carving, Gingerbread House decorating and more! The goal is to provide every opportunity for children to socialize, develop their identity, and to develop language. Each student's parents, siblings, and family are encouraged to join in the events and activities. We have also opened up the Friday Family Days to include students from other schools that are connected to the SDHHS Early Childhood Family Services (ECFS) program. Robyn Holmes, the ECFS Worker, supports these students and their parents when they opt to attend the Friday events.









Our Dinosaur theme is over and the class is now focussed on the Ocean. We ensure that access is provided to both languages for the students in the classroom. Everything is labelled in written English, ASL, and includes visual pictures of the vocabulary. This allows Miss Nicole to naturally expose students to ASL and written English. Daily language learning happens when communication and understanding occur.









CCCC Preschool Continued

Miss Nicole continues to teach and develop the program by expanding resources, such as **Language First** and **Visual Language Visual Learning**. These are highly recommended for new parents and professionals. She has reached out to other Deaf teachers from Alberta and Manitoba to see what they offer for their d/Deaf and Hard of Hearing students. They were kind enough to share various ASL assessment tools and resources. Our plan is to stay in touch with them in the future. The ongoing support this Winter is greatly appreciated by Miss Nicole!

We have a new student joining us at the 4C Preschool. If you know any d/Deaf or Hard of Hearing children in the community or children that are a part of a d/Deaf or Hard of Hearing family, we can easily be contacted to register children with the 4C Preschool. The 4C Preschool classroom operates from Monday to Thursday, 9 am to 12 pm and every Friday we build parent connections with Family Day events.
